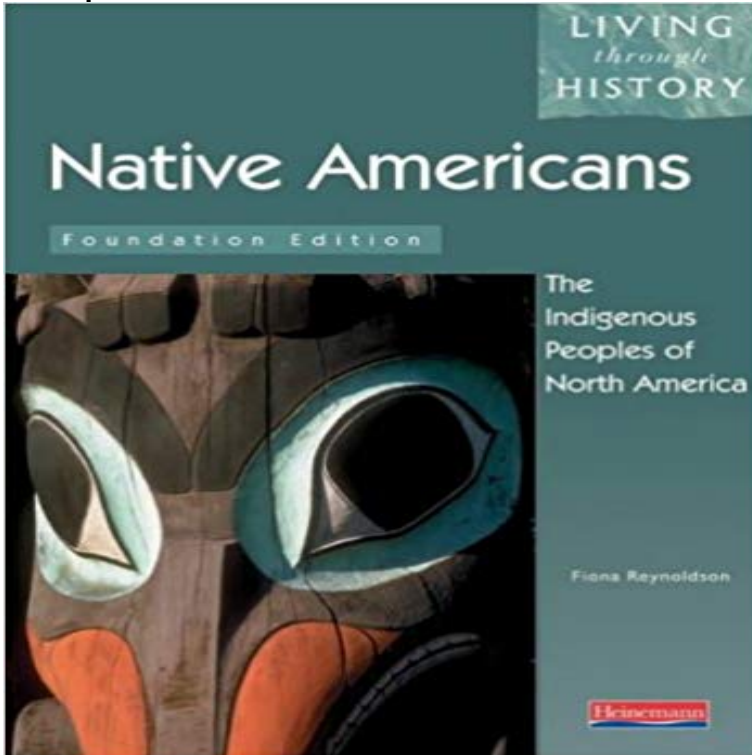


Living Through History: Foundation Book. Native Americans Indigenous Peoples of North America
