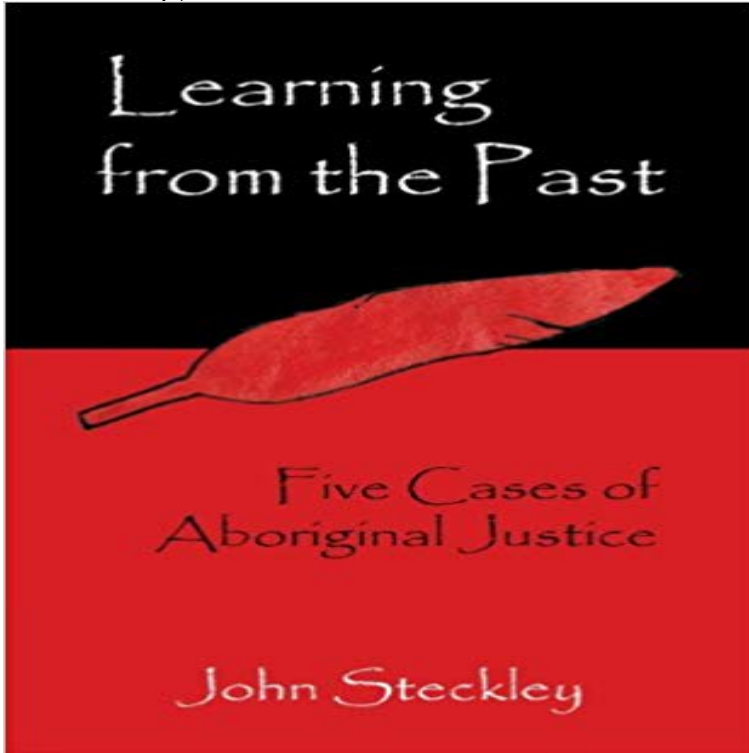


Learning from the Past: Five Cases of Aboriginal Justice
