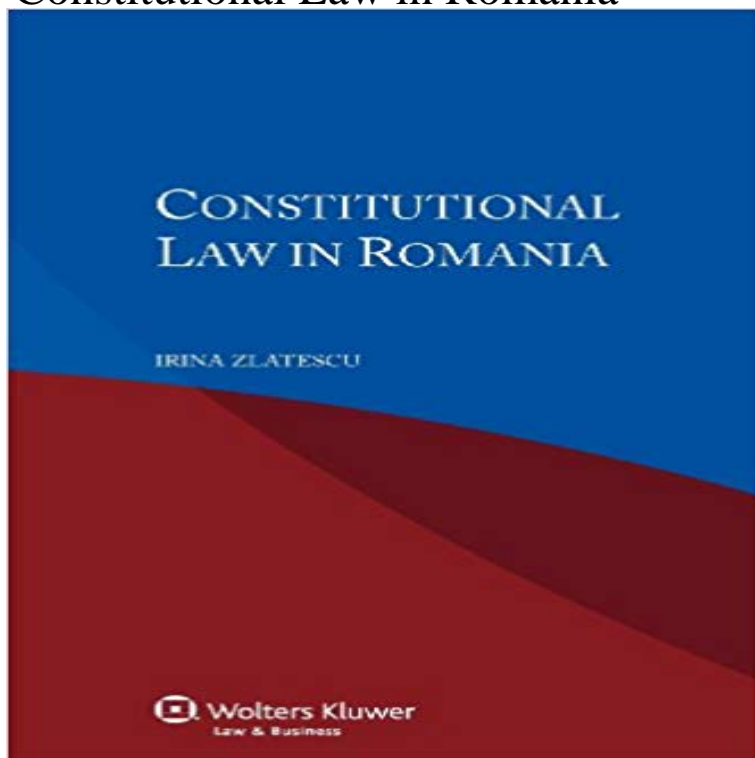


Constitutional Law in Romania
